SUPPLY & DELIVERY OF ROAD TRAFFIC SIGNS & STANDS

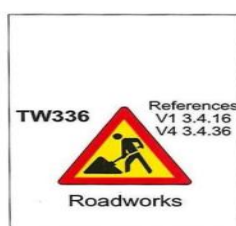
The municipality requires the services of a service provider that will supply & deliver road traffic signs & stands for the roads and stormwater section.

Temporary Road Signs (for Work-Zone / Pothole Repair)

Temporary signs used during pothole patching / road repair sites help warn, direct and regulate traffic. These are typically classified as **regulatory**, **warning**, **guide (direction)**, and **traffic-control** signs.

Typical Sign Types

- **Advance warning signs** — e.g. "Roadworks Ahead", "Pothole Repair Ahead", "Men at Work / Workers Ahead". TW336 These alert approaching drivers to upcoming road-work.



- **Temporary speed-limit signs** — reducing speed through the work zone, typically using temporary signage (e.g. "TR201" speed sign when speed limit is lowered for works) rather than permanent signs.



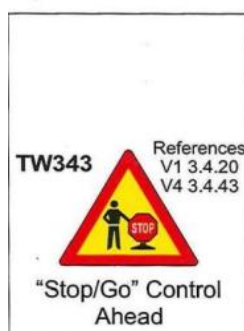
- **Lane closure / merge signs** — e.g. signs indicating "Left (or Right) Lane Ends," "Merge," or "Single Lane Traffic." Useful when patching requires partial lane closures.



- **Detour / diversion signs** — when traffic must be redirected around the work zone via an alternate route. These may include diagrammatic guidance signs showing the temporary alignment.



- **Stop / Go / traffic-control signs** — used when manual traffic control is used e.g. at narrow sections, partial closures), often in combination with flaggers.



- **End-of-works signs** — indicating the end of the temporary roadworks zone so normal traffic rules resume (e.g. original speed limit) once the work ends.



Sign design & materials requirements

- Temporary signs must follow the SADC/Road-Traffic-Signs standards (or local equivalent).
- Retroreflective materials should be used so that signs are clearly visible at night or in poor light.
- It is often recommended temporary signs use a higher grade of reflectivity than permanent signs in the same location to maximize visibility and safety.
- Temporary signage design must reflect the current work conditions signs should only be shown when relevant (e.g. remove “Workers Ahead” if no workers present), to avoid driver confusion or desensitization.

Traffic-Control Channelization Devices & Barriers

In addition to signs, physical devices help guide or block traffic, create safe workspace, and separate workers from moving vehicles:

- **Traffic cones** (with reflective sleeves) — used for lane delineation, marking hazards, narrowing lanes, directing traffic around a work zone.



- **Delineators** (plastic posts, flexible or reboundable) mounted on stable bases — used for longer-term channelization, guiding traffic flow, marking edges of lanes or work zones.



- **Barricades or barriers** — for example water-filled barriers or rigid interlocking plastic barriers, used to cordon off the work zone if needed, or to protect workers from vehicles.



- **Traffic-control board or STOP/GO trolley (portable stop/go board)** — for manual traffic control when works disrupt normal traffic flow.



Lighting & Visibility Equipment

Especially if pothole patching or repairs happen in low-light conditions or at night, good lighting and visibility gear are critical:

- **Amber (yellow) flashing lights** or rotating beacons on site vehicles and heavy machinery used during works, to alert road users to slow-moving or stationary equipment.

- **Red Safety Flag with Reflective X and 1m PVC Handle (57 × 62 cm)**



- **Traffic signs steel stand 1.8m**

 - i. Municipal Account in the bidder_(Company)'s name.
 - ii. Proof of residence in the bidder_(company)'s name.
 - iii. Bank statement with the bidder_(Company)'s address.
 - iv. Lease agreement indicating a local address, where the lessee is the bidder.
- e. The bidder must submit proof of locality to claim points for locality.
- f. Bidder failing to provide the proof of locality, shall claim zero points for locality.

1.4 To be completed by the organ of state:

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (c) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) **“tender for income-generating contracts”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) **“the Act”** means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

3. FORMULAE FOR PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND SERVICES

3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

3.1.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

3.2. FORMULAE FOR DISPOSAL OR LEASING OF STATE ASSETS AND INCOME GENERATING PROCUREMENT

3.2.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

80/20 or 90/10

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:

4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—

(a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or

(b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system,

then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.
